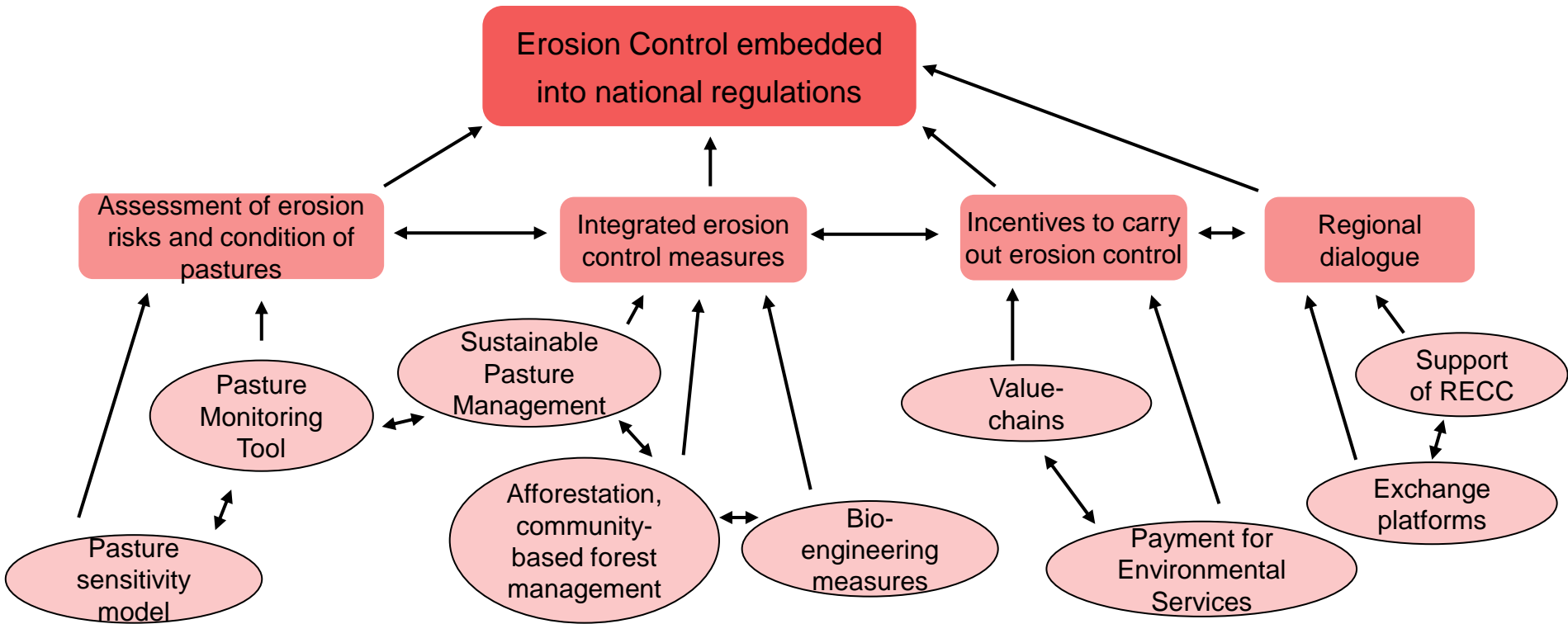
Integrated erosion control is embedded into national regulations on sustainable land use and biodiversity conservation
